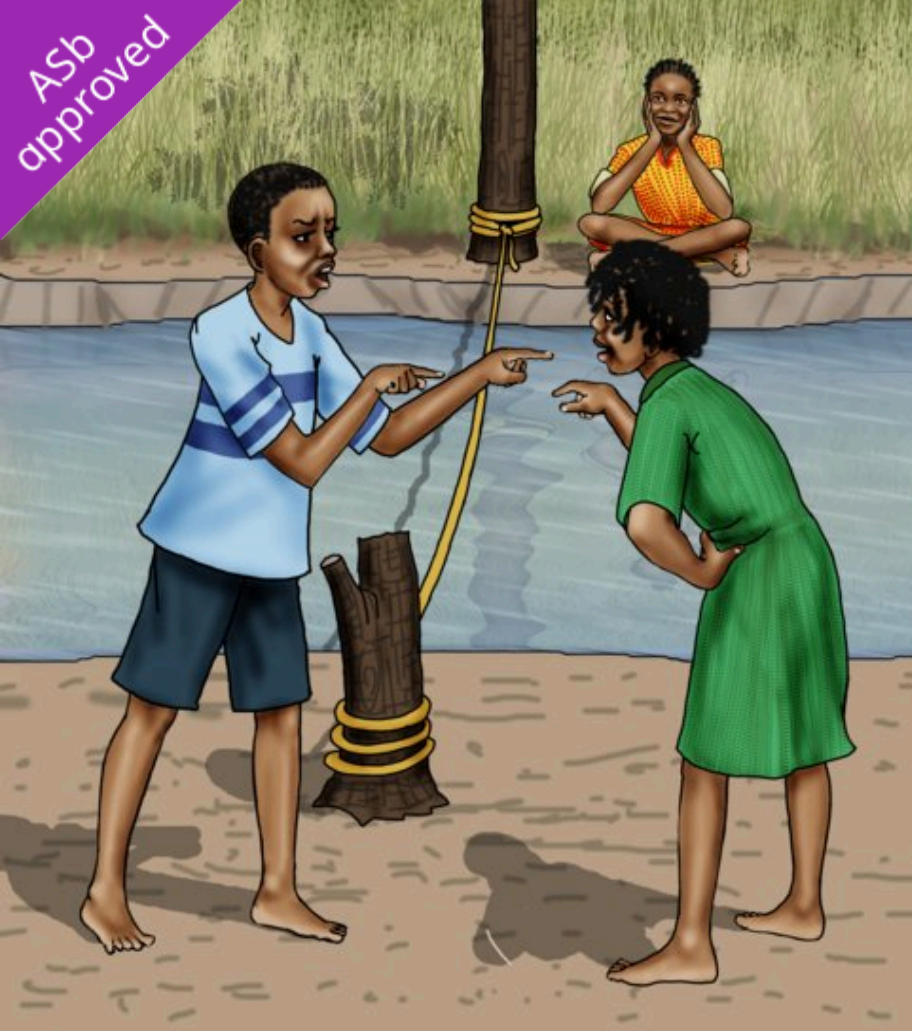

then went to sleep.



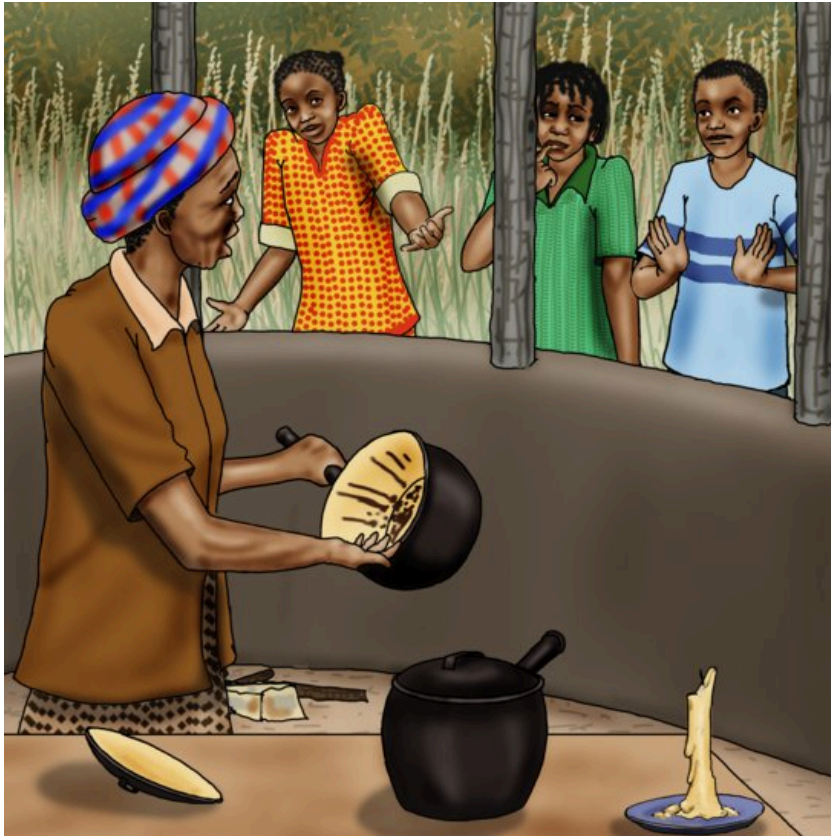
The old woman and two children were tired and hungry when they returned from the field.
