Then came the third fish, the biggest one they had seen. Muneza said laughing, "It is bigger than father's feet!"



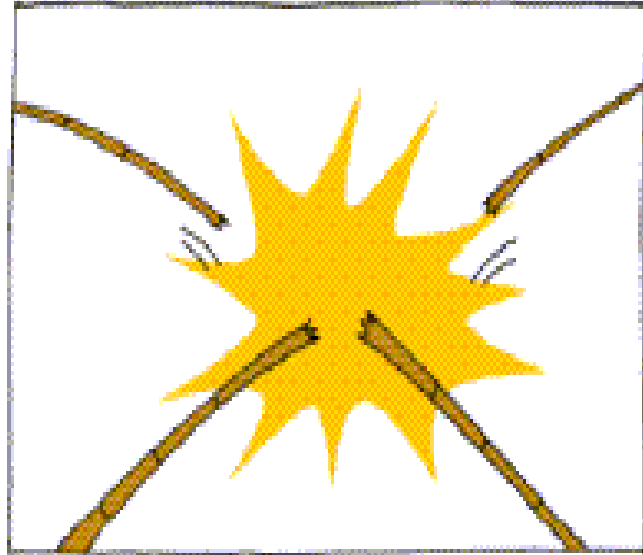
Kalisa and Kamali

"NO... MY FISH!"

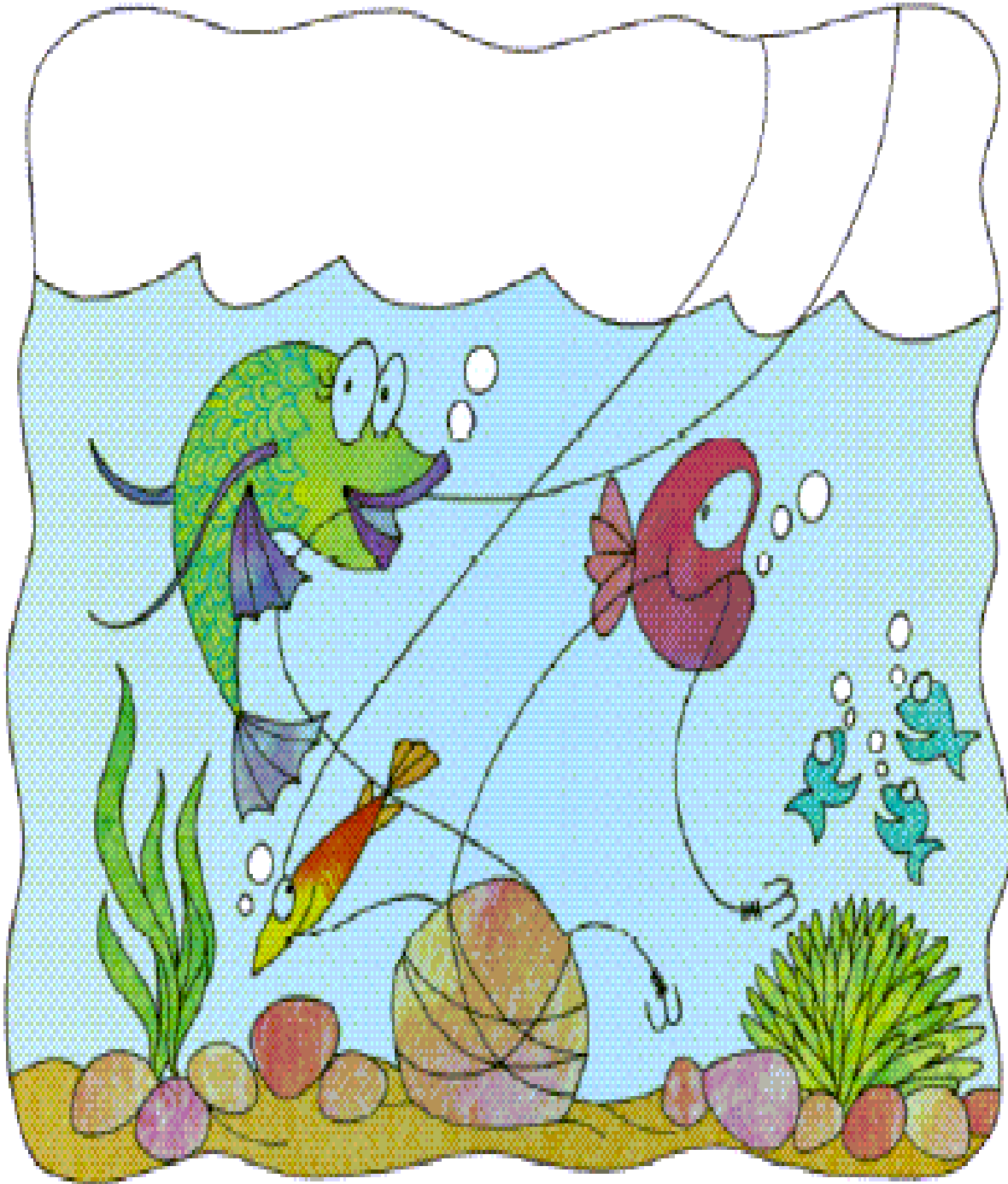


Kalisa pulled hard...
