fell to his ankles.



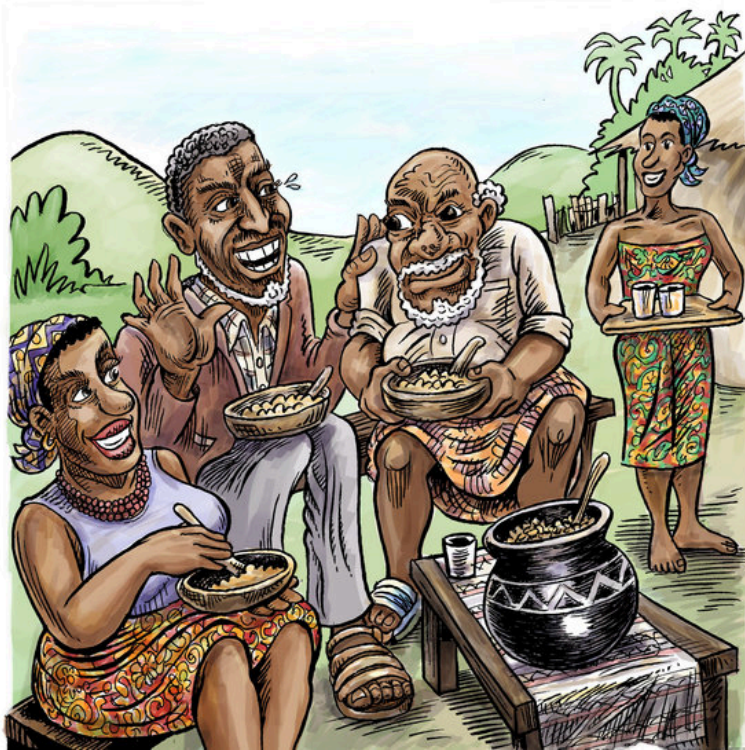
He tried to grab the cloth but let go of the eagle.
