
The rains did not come. The land was very dry.




This monkey left home to look for water and food.




She walked over

place named Bwiza.




Monkey was very happy in this place.




She ate fruit and

missed her friends.




So Monkey made


The other monkeys were joyful to see her.




"Where is this wonderful place with fruit?" they asked her.

The other monkeys loved Bwiza. They decided to stay there forever.




But the monkeys from Bwiza were worried.




"These new monkeys will eat all our fruit," they said.
