Introduce Vocabulary

Teacher may select words to present based on student needs.

*Verbs

looking, moving, stuck, swims, bumps, cries, puffs, rises

- Show the verb with actions/gestures ("cry" pretend to cry)
- Say the word in a sentence and ask students to repeat chorally
- Say the word in a sentence and ask one or more individual students to repeat
- Teacher will say and act out a sentence with the verbs and students will copy
 Example: "The Pufferfish swims around and around." "He bumps into rocks"
 The students will repeat the sentences and use actions / gestures to act out the sentences.
- Nouns: pufferfish, starfish, crab, octopus, tide pool, tube feet, rock, circles, sea
 - Show pictures from the book of each noun
 - ❖ Adjectives (describing words): baby, orange, pink, big, low, high
 - **Feeling words:** scared, happy, stuck

Introductory Activity for the Story

- The story we will read today is called *Whoop*, *Goes the Pufferfish*.
- The words we just learned are about animals that live in a tide pool which is near the ocean. What animals live in the land or water around where you live?

Making Predictions Based on the Cover

- What do you see?
- Who will be in this story?
- Where do you think it will take place?
- What do you think will happen in this story? Write a list.

Read the Story

- Teacher reads the story with expression, interest and curiosity
- Teacher may read the story in the home language first, if it is available.
- Stop at Key Stopping Points as listed below.

Key Stopping Points

- Page 2: What does peaceful mean? Does this picture look peaceful or calming to you?
- Page 3: What other characters are in the story?
- Page 6: What is happening to the baby Pufferfish
- Page 7. What do Crab and Starfish tell the Pufferfish?
- Page 8: What do you see in this picture?
- Page 9: Who solves the problem? How?
- Page 11: How is everyone feeling now? Why?

End of Story

- Before we read the story, we predicted that ______. (see list)
- What was the problem at the beginning? (the pufferfish can't get out of the tidepool)
- What did the starfish, crab and octopus do to help him?
- How was the problem solved?
- What lesson did you learn from this story

When we wonder about a story, we share our feelings or ideas. There are no right or wrong answers.

- I wonder if there's a part of the story you liked?
- I wonder if you've ever felt like the Pufferfish?
- I wonder what was the most important part of the story for you?
- I wonder who you will share this story with after school?
